

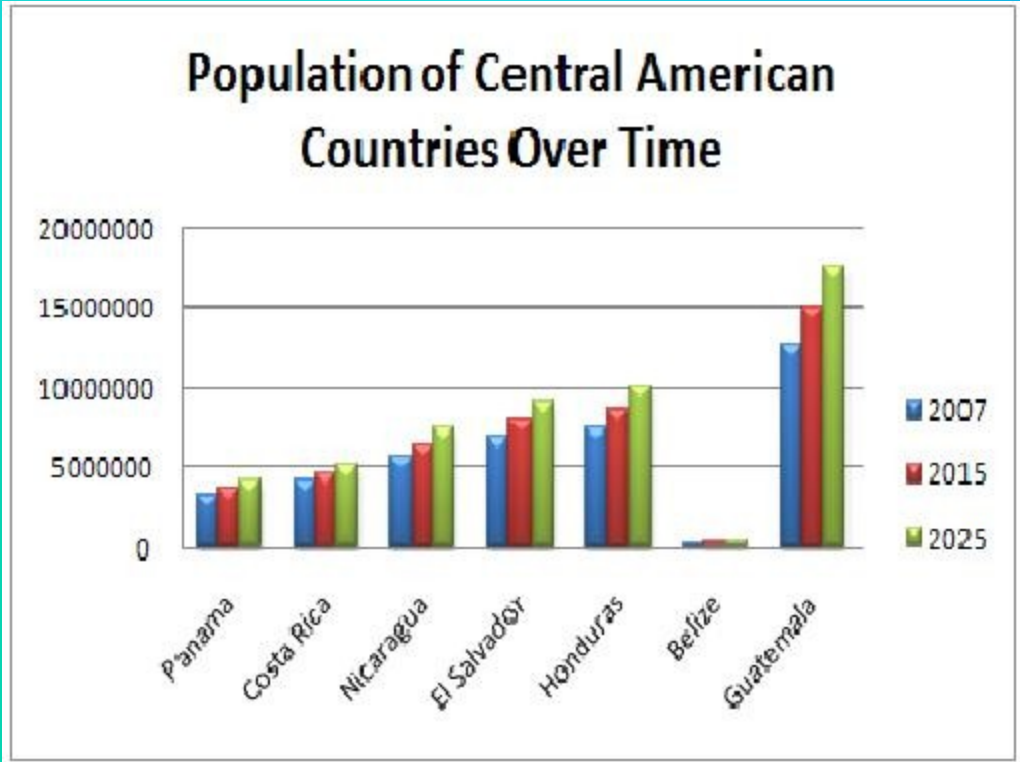
Statistics on Central Americas Population

A poster that shows detailed data on Central America’s population in growth, birth rate, death rate, and even migration rate.

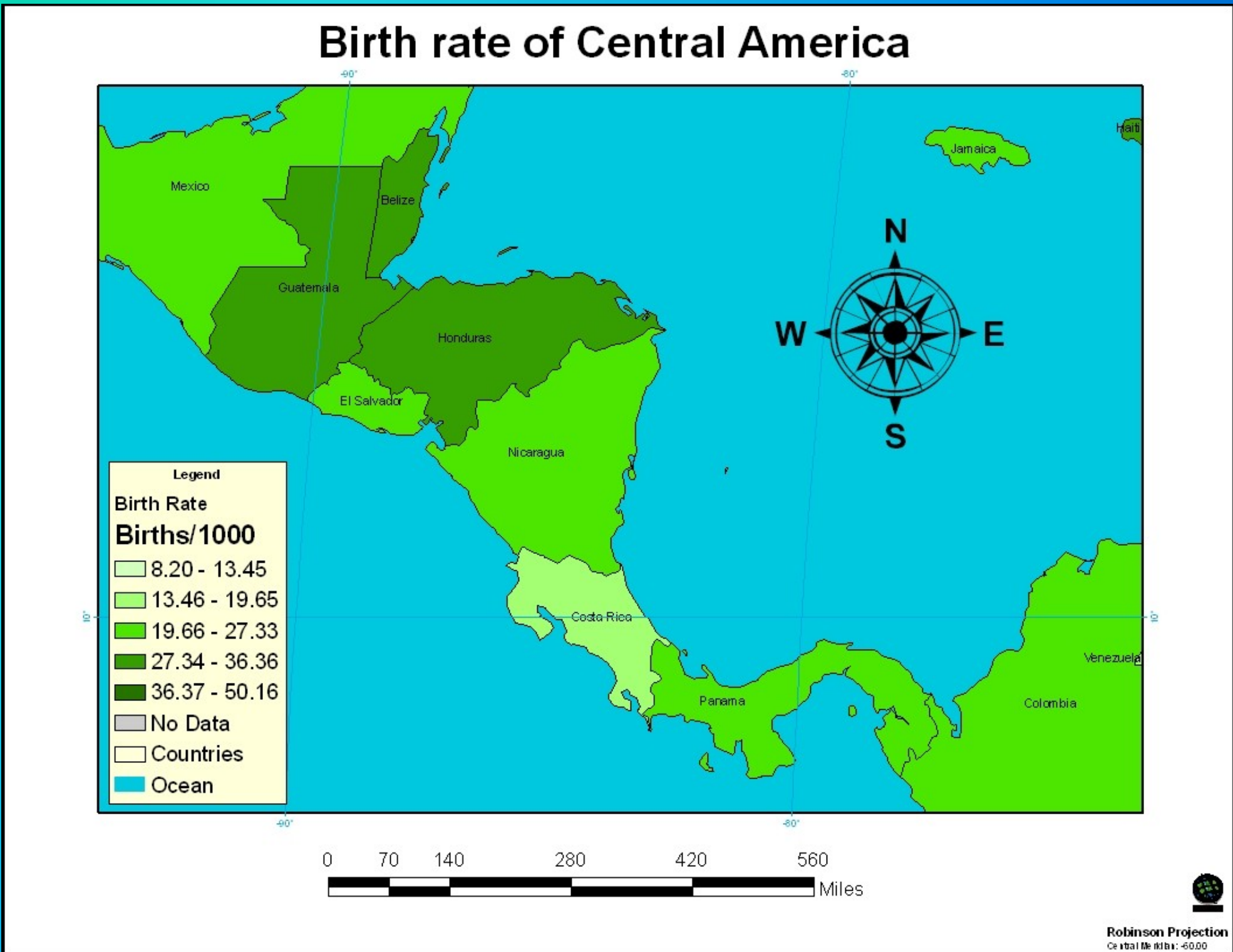
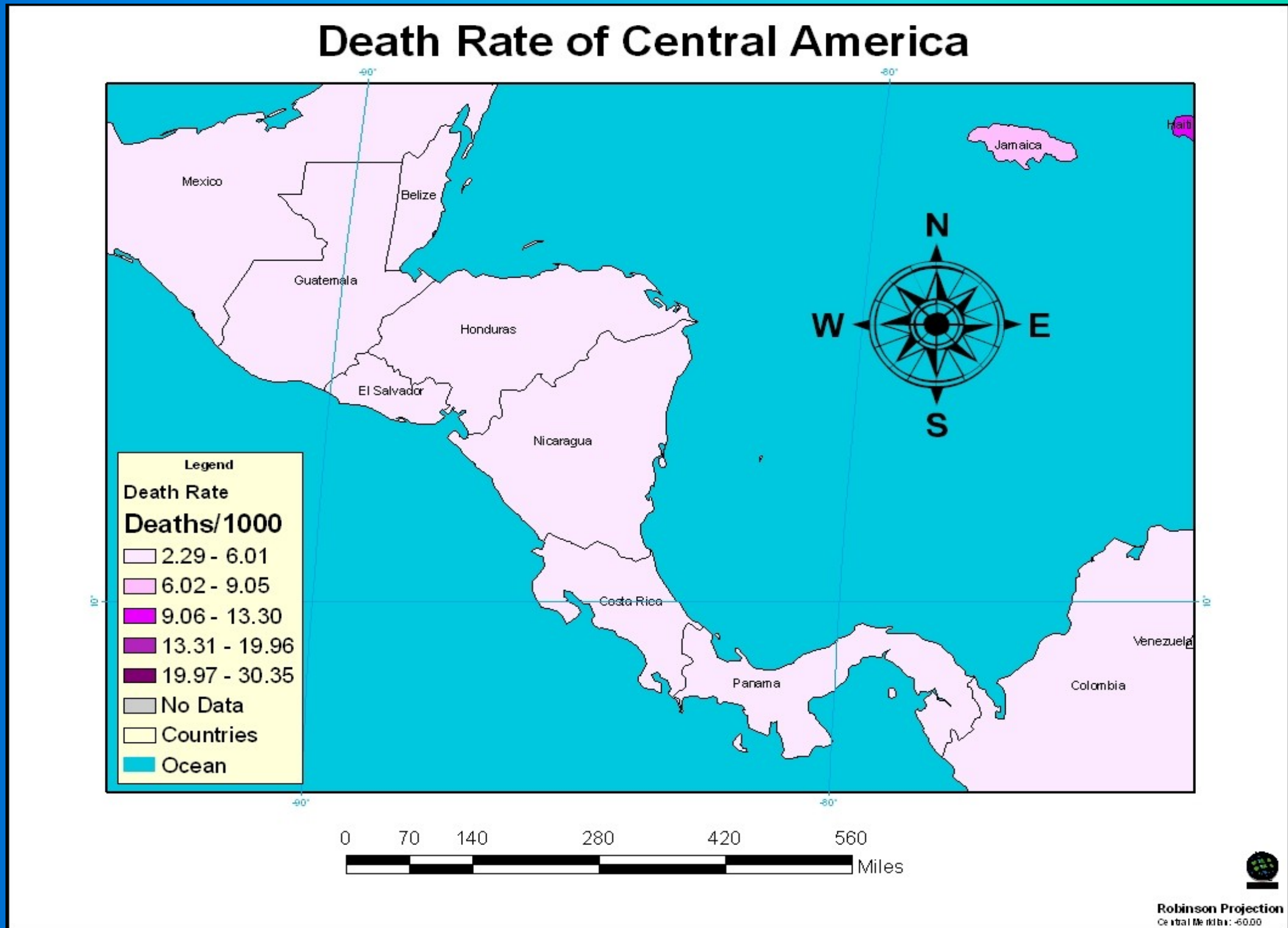
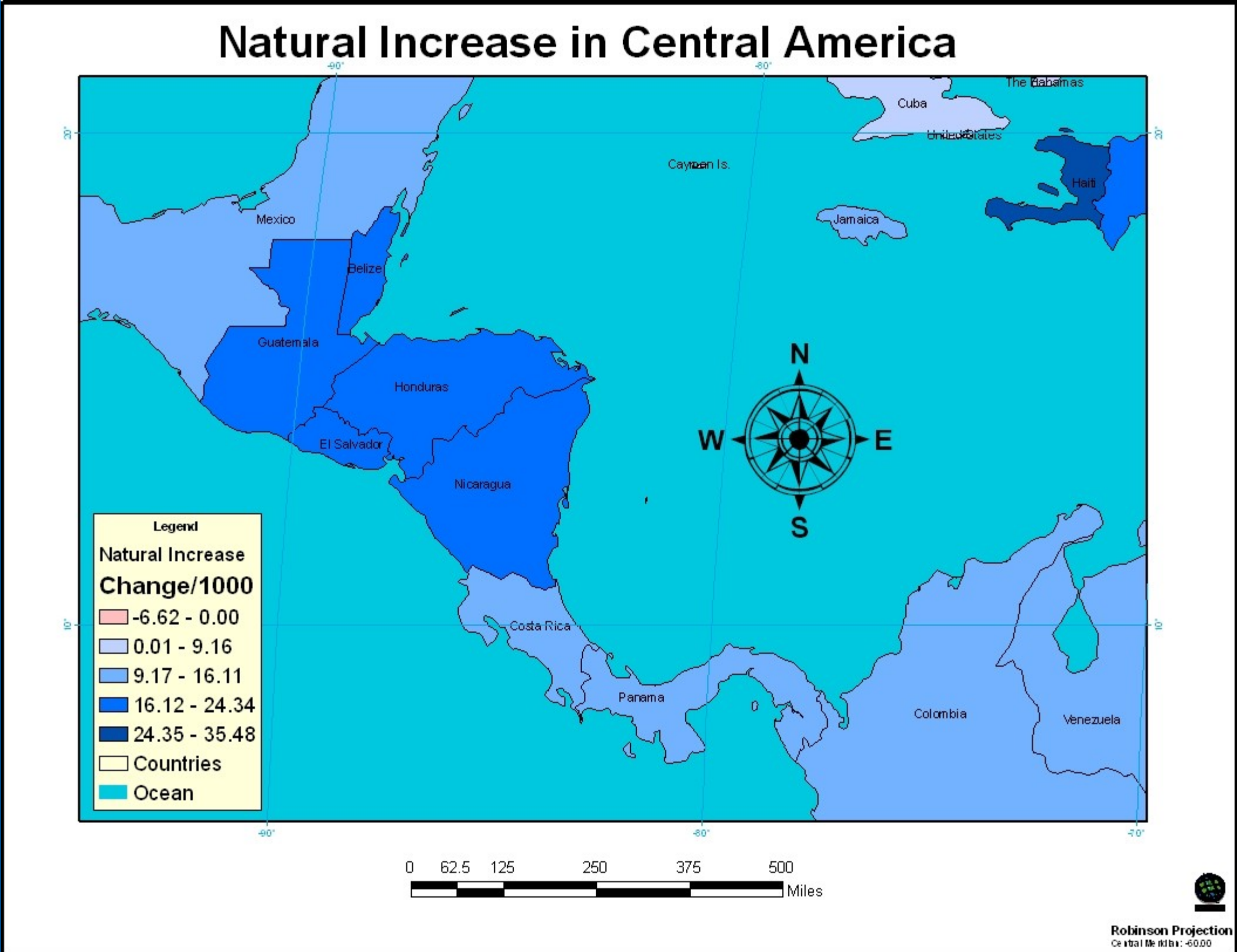
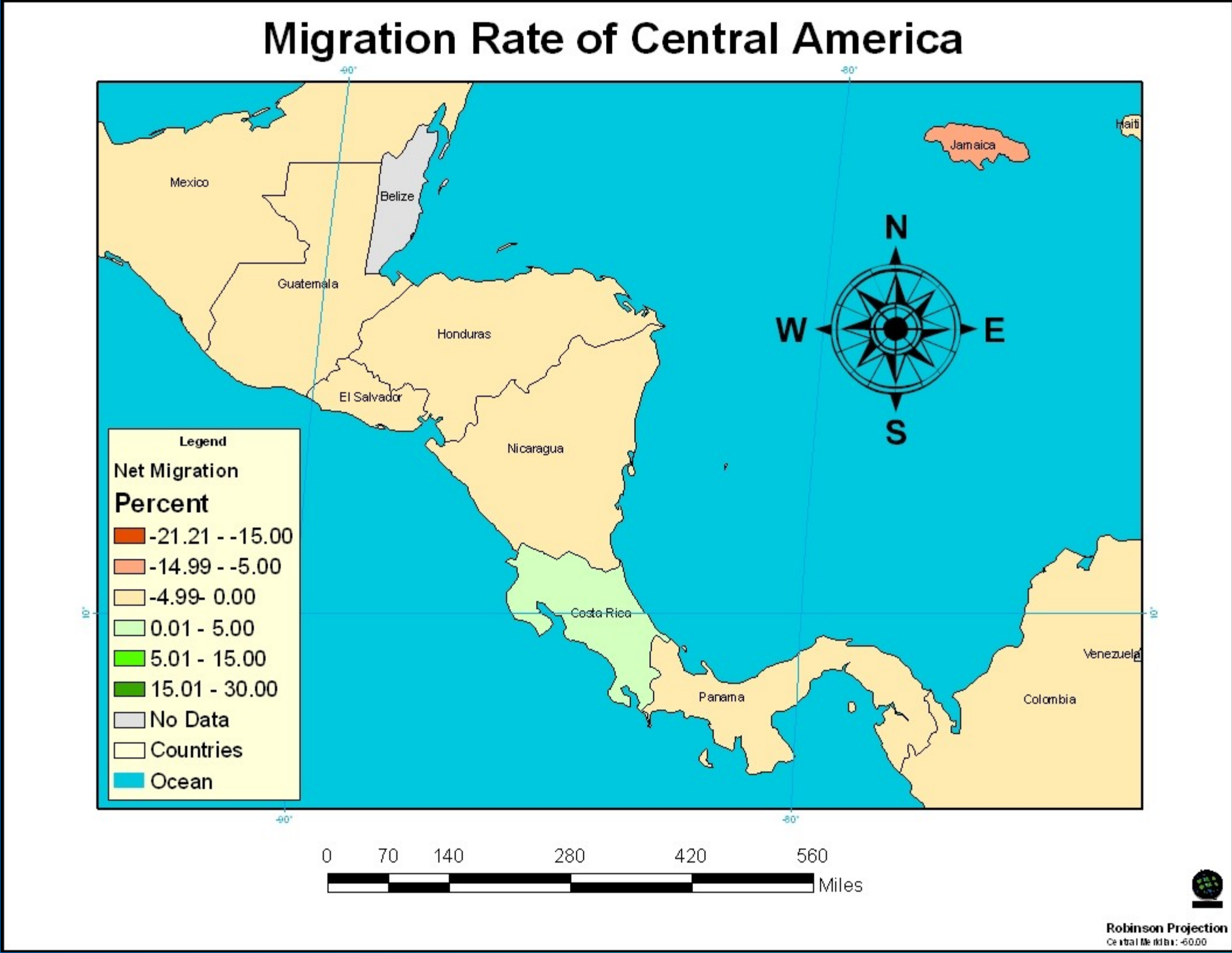

Migration Rate of Central America– This map displays the rate at which migration in these countries are occurring. According to these statistics, the migration rate in most of these countries is negative. In other words, more people are leaving the countries, than are entering.

Natural Increase of Central America– This map depicts the population growth in Central American countries. The map shows that the amount of people being born are greater then the amount of people dying.

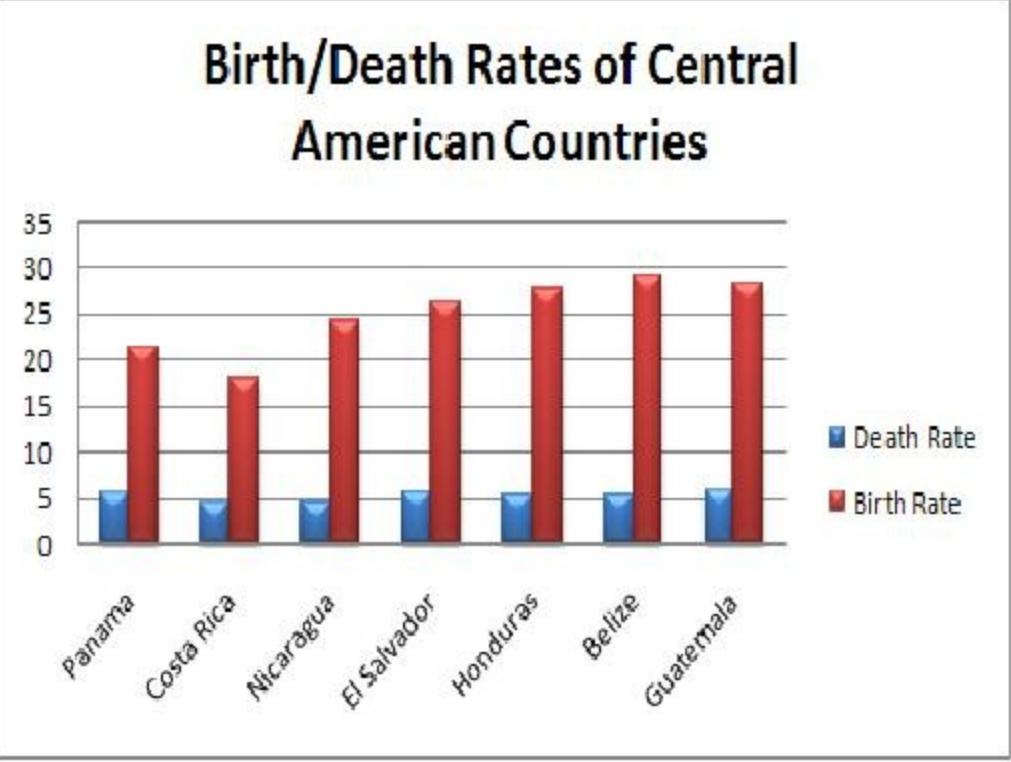


Population of Central America Over Time– This graph predicts the growth of Central American countries in the future. This graph is just taking data we already know and predicting how that data will change over time.
